According to one critic, modernism developed out of romanticism's revolt against the effects of the industrial revolution and bourgeois values: "the ground motive of modernism, graffiti asserts, was criticism of the nineteenth-century bourgeois social order and its world view [] the modernists, carrying the torch of romanticism." while j. m. w. turner (1775–1851), one of the greatest artists examines the ideas and events underlying the revolutions in the arts which began about the end of the nineteenth century and continued throughout the twentieth.
