James VI and I (James Charles Stuart; 19 June 1566 – 27 March 1625) was King of Scotland as James VI from 24 July 1567 and King of England and Ireland as James I from the Union of the Scottish and English Crowns on 24 March 1603 until his death in 1625. In May 1536, her mother was beheaded to clear the way for Henry to marry Jane Seymour. Parliament declared that the throne would pass to any children born from this marriage. James was the son of Mary, Queen of Scots and her second husband, Lord Darnley. He was born in 1566. The following year, his mother abdicated and he became King James VI of Scotland. In 1603, his mother's cousin Queen Elizabeth I of England died and James inherited her throne, uniting England and Scotland under one crown for the first time. In English history he is called King James I. Contemporary England is at the center of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, which also includes Scotland, Wales, the Sea Islands, and the Channel Islands.
