

# Who Was Amelia Earhart

Earhart was the daughter of samuel "edwin" stanton earhart (1867–1930) and amelia "amy" (née otis; 1869–1962) she was born in atchison, kansas, in the home of her maternal grandfather, alfred gideon otis (1827–1912), who was a former federal judge, the president of the atchison savings bank and a leading citizen in the town. amelia was the second child of the marriage, after an infant amelia stars two-time academy award-winner hilary swank as amelia earhart, the legendary aviatrix. also featuring richard gere and ewan mcgregorhn cerney's "amelia comes home" mural: located on the east side of amelia earhart highway (us 73 - just south of 262nd road). the 38' by 11' mural was a gift to the atchison community from nationally acclaimed artist john cerney. amelia earhart became the first woman to fly across the atlantic ocean in 1928, as well as the first person to fly over both the atlantic and pacific. did you know? when earhart disappeared in amelia mary earhart (atchison, kansas, estados unidos, 24 de julio de 1897 - desaparecida en el océano pacífico, 2 de julio de 1937) [1] fue una aviadora estadounidense, célebre por sus marcas de vuelo y por intentar el primer viaje aéreo alrededor del mundo sobre la línea ecuatorial. amelia earhart (ordinary people change the world) [brad meltzer, christopher eliopoulos] on amazon. \*free\* shipping on qualifying offers. we can all be heroes. that's the inspiring message of this lively, collectible picture book biography series from new york times bestselling author brad meltzer. take off with amelia earhart, the most famous aviatrix of all time, whose last flight remains a mystery. amelia earhart was born on july 24, 1897, the daughter of edwin and amy otis earhart. until she was twelve she lived with her wealthy maternal grandparents, alfred and amelia harres otis, in atcheson, kansas, where she attended a private school. her summers were spent in kansas city, missouri as a child, she spent the winter months with her grandparents in atchison and the summers with her parents in kansas city, kansas. earhart's grandparents, alfred and amelia otis were well off, and although amelia would know some financial hardship in her teens and twenties, her early life was spent in the midst of plenty. amelia earhart went 'missing' in 1937 and was declared "dead in absentia" after no trace of her was found. in 1970, irene craigmile, a respected and admired person by her peers, denied herself to be amelia earhart. amelia earhart is best known for being the first woman to complete the feat, but it wasn't like a whole slew of men had accomplished the task before her. she was only the second person ever to the legendary pilot amelia earhart famously disappeared during an ill-fated attempt to fly around the world in 1937. earhart's last whereabouts remain unknown, but a new study adds weight to one
