[citation needed] his siblings were sarah lincoln grigsby and thomas lincoln, jr. after a land title dispute forced the family to leave, they relocated to knob creek farm, eight miles to the north. 1814 thomas lincoln, abraham's father, had lost most of the farm. abraham lincoln (february 12, 1809 – april 15, 1865) was an american lawyer and politician who served as the 16th president of the united states from 1861 until his assassination in april 1865. lincoln led the nation through the civil war, its bloodiest war and its greatest moral, constitutional, and political crisis. in doing so, he preserved the union, abolished slavery, and strengthened the starting life in a log cabin. abraham lincoln was born to thomas and nancy lincoln on february 12, 1809, in a log cabin on a farm in hardin county, kentucky.
